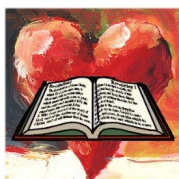

So, What is Worship?

I believe the Bible teaches that worship is primarily for God. Interestingly enough, the Bible does not record God saying, "I seek dedicated, educated hard workers," but rather, God did say, "I seek worshippers." A.W. Tozer states it so well: *Worship . . . the Missing Jewel of the Evangelical Church.*

Worship is an art that on a continuing basis needs to be cultivated. It is a major life principle which needs considerable effort on the part of the worshippers. It is not a spiritual fad that is here now and will disappear later; it has nothing to do with the salvation of a man's soul; it does release the power and presence of God in one's life. Simply stated, it is an all-encompassing response to a great and holy God!



Worship is the supreme duty of the creature toward the Creator; it is adoration and honor directed toward a worthy God; it is doing for God what He cannot do for Himself; it is a celebration of God's majesty and gracious goodness. Really, it is ascribing to God His worth.

When this matter of worship is expressed properly, it could result in many physical responses, as described in Scripture: kneeling, talking together in groups, the clapping of hands, singing, the playing of instruments, standing before our Lord, the raising of hands, verbalized prayer, exchange of prayer requests, public testimony, weeping, laughter, right hand of fellowship, reading of God's Word aloud, joining of hands, lifting of our heads, verbalized praise—and, frankly, much more! **It must always be practiced in the control of the Holy Spirit, "with understanding"!**

MISSIONS JUNE

Mission Focus. Our mission focus this month is *Family First Pregnancy Care Center and Family Diaper Bank*, with locations in Oracle and Winkleman, Arizona. This openly Christian, non-profit ministry continues to operate under the able direction of Clare Grochocki.

Family First provides education and material assistance to expectant mothers

through their *Earn While You Learn* program. Young people who complete classes in such topics as prenatal care, parenting and child development, earn credits which can then be used to purchase infant products available at the center. New programs are continually added as clients' needs are identified. The *Fatherhood* program helps young dads learn valuable parenting skills in a setting that specifically accommodates them. A program for teens addresses issues of violence and abuse in the dating relationship while continuing to promote abstinence. Wednesday morning *Story Time* gives moms a chance to socialize along with their toddlers, with stories, games and crafts. The Oracle facility, at 1575 W American Avenue, will host a fund-raising rummage sale on Saturday, June 11. Greetings Ladies,

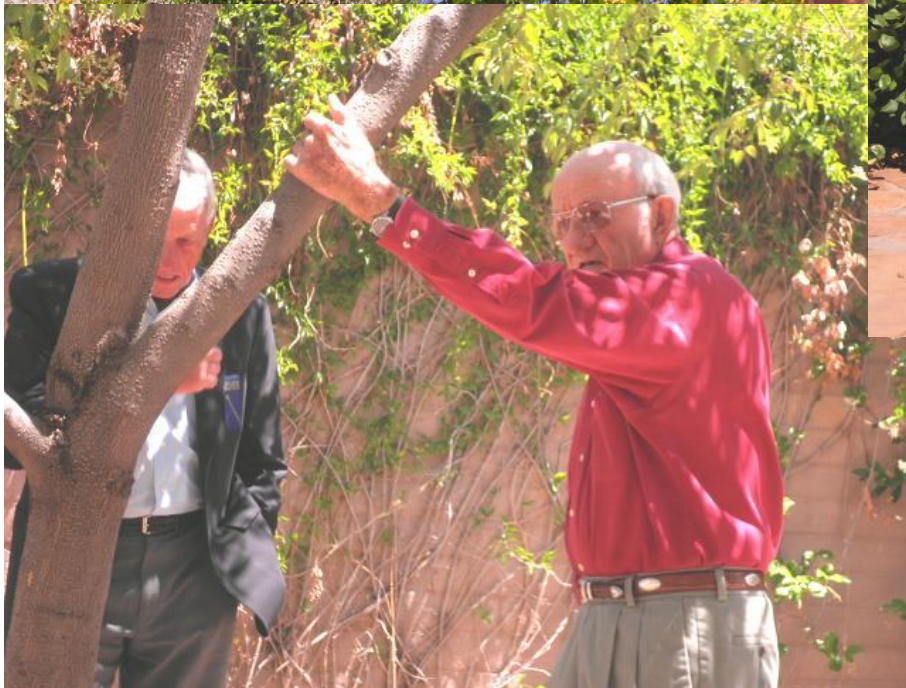
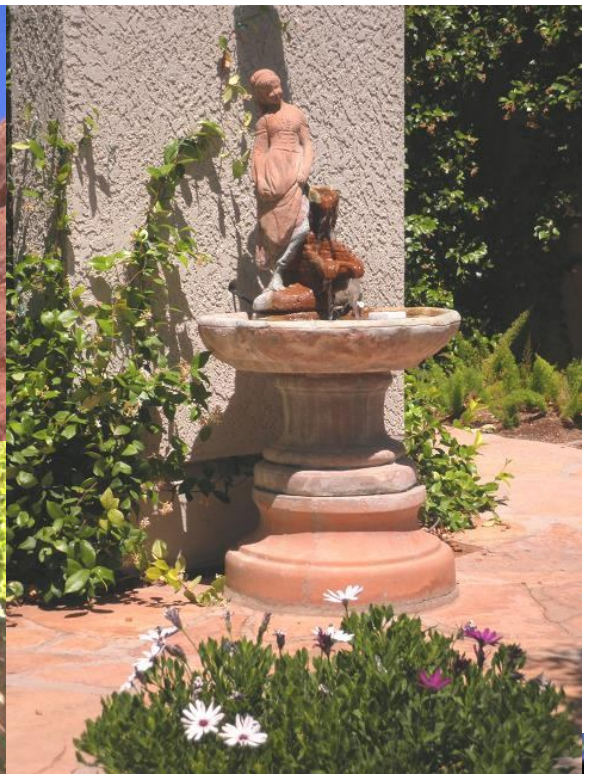
